PLUM COULEE POLICE ACTIVITY HIGHLIGHTS JUNE 2026

On the 5th of June, Police received a 911 call to an apartment complex in Plum Coulee. Police attended and learnt that a tenant had a neighbor over for some drinks, and a dispute started. The neighbor refused to leave when requested to. The neighbor left, when she saw the complainant calling police.

On the 6th of June Police received a call from a Plum Coulee resident requesting police assistance. She advise she is having issues with a male who keeps contacting her and coming over uninvited. She wants the male to stop communicating with her. Police contacted the male and advised him to stop all communication and stop attending to her residence. The male advised he understood, and agreed to stop.

Over the past several months, Police have received several 911 open line calls from an address in Plum Coulee. All calls to 911 were false, and the homeowner never dialed the calls. It is believed that there are issues with the land line phone, and the home owner was advised to contact his telephone provider.

On the 13th of June Police received a call from a resident of Plum Coulee advising that after a break up, her ex partner is refusing to return some of her property. Police in an attempt to resolve this issue, contacted the ex partner, who advised police that her property is stored I his garage, and she can come get it anytime, as long as she makes arrangements ahead of time. This message was relayed to the complainant. No further police involvement required.

On the 18th of June Police received complaints in relation to children operating off road vehicles in Plum Coulee. Police attended and located the children. Police spoke to the parents and issued warnings for the operation of the off road vehicles within Plum Coulee.

On the 26th of June Police were called to Plum Coulee for a complaint of a stolen vehicle. Police were advised that the victim was at a business in Plum Coulee, when a white truck pulled. The driver exited this truck, jumped into the victim's truck and drove away. Police confirmed that the white truck the suspect pulled up in was a stolen vehicle from Winnipeg. Police have been in contact with Winnipeg Police, as they have suspects related to their offence.
